<u>Ramen Noodle Fritata</u>

2 (3 oz.) packets chicken flavored ramen noodles 6 eggs 2 t butter ½ C shredded cheddar cheese

Reserving the seasoning packets, cook noodles in boiling water until tender. Drain. In a medium bowl, whisk together the eggs and seasoning packets from the noodles. Mix in noodles. Melt butter in a large skillet over medium heat. Add the noodle mixture, and cook over medium-low heat until firm, 5 to  $\neq$  minutes. Cut into fourths and turn over to brown the other side for 1 to 2 minutes. Sprinkle cheese over the top, and serve.
