
December 7, 2011 is the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the attack

#### Luminaries



Please join your neighbors in displaying luminaries at 5 pm Christmas Eve. Here are some helpful hints.

- 1. Determine where you want your luminaries to be located.
- Determine how many paper bags you will need. Luminaries are usually spaced about 2 feet apart.
- Buy an equal number of lunch-size paper bags.
- Purchase a small votive candle for each paper bag.
- Use sand or bird seed to weigh down the bags. Each bag should have about a 2-inch base for lunch-size bags.
- Twist a votive candle into the middle of the bottom of the bag, making sure it's secure.
- 7. As dusk falls, light each candle for a striking holiday glow.
