The maintenance fee for 2014 is \$28 per month. The fee for 2015 will also be \$28 per month.



<u>"The Way We Were"</u>



Dec., 1934 - **Del Shannon**, best known for hís 1961 No. 1 hít, "Runaway", was born ín Grand Rapíds, Míchígan.

Dec., 1939 - "Gone with the Wind" premíered in Atlanta. Dec., 1944 - Les Horvath won the Heisman Trophy, the fírst of 7 by an Ohío State player. Dec., 1949 - Leon Hart won the Heisman Trophy, the third of 7 by a Notre Dame player. Dec., 1954 - U.S. Senate censured Sen. Joe McCarthy, *R-Wis*consin, for "conduct that tends to bring the Senate into dishonor and disrepute". Dec., 1959 - Walter Williams, thought to be the last survivor of the Civil War, died at age 117. Dec., 1964 - Canadian House of Commons and Senate passed legislation adopting the Maple Leaf flag (Note: The flag was not officially displayed for the first time until Feb. 15, 1965).

- 5. Twist a candle into the middle of the bottom of the container, making sure it's secure.
- 6. As dusk falls, light each candle for a striking holiday glow.
