



### Hawaiian Wedding Cake

Cake

2 C Sugar 2 C Flour 2 Eggs 2 tsp. Baking Soda 1 20 Oz. Can Crushed

1 C Chopped Nuts

Pineapple (undrained)

Frosting
4 Oz. Cream Cheese
1 Stick Butter
1-2 C Conf. Sugar
½ - 1 tsp. Vanilla

Put sugar, flour, eggs, baking soda, pineapple, and nuts in a large bowl. Using a large spoon, blend well. Bake in a 9X13 inch greased pan for 30-40 minutes at 350 degrees. Meanwhile, mix cream cheese and butter. Blend in sugar and vanilla. Cool the cake until barely

warm, then frost. Chill well before cutting.
