Voting for the Board of Directors concluded just prior to the start of the Annual Meeting on Feb. 5th. 187 ballots were distributed and 122 ballots were returned. Of those, 1 ballot was left blank. The results were as follows: For President, Bob Gilliland, 69 votes and Ralph Schioppa, 52 votes; for Vice-president, Richard Griffith, 80 votes and Glenn McGill, 41 votes; for Director-at-large, Pauleen Lacourse, 78 votes and Darrell Grogan, 43 votes. Kathy Holder, running for Treasurer, and Maureen Huff, running for Secretary, as they were unopposed, were declared automatic winners. The other three Director-at-large positions, held by **Butch** Sims, Rick Gillispie, and Tim Burchfield, dídn't require a vote this year.

To Ralph, Glenn, and Darrell, even though the election did not go your way, thanks for participating in this important process. You are all to be commended.
