Bob and **Dorie Bonhoff** started this iteration of a Mobile Manor newsletter a little over 10 years ago. It was cal-

led the "Mobile Manor Mindsweeper". I think it would be interesting to reprint some of their articles from time to time. In their 2nd edition, April 2004, the following historical items appeared:

The clubhouse was at one time the resi dence of Mr. S.T. Jones and was located on the south side of Bayshore Road; however, before the area became Mobile Manor, the house was moved to its present location. The oldest organized group to make use of this building was the Hobby Club. While it was not given that name then, it met December 22, 1962, for the first time. It has continued to be one of the highlights of the park and meets every Tuesday. Another of the older activities is the Bible Study Class. It meets every Thursday afternoon with 15 to 35 in attendance.

It was in early 1966 that the Landowners Association was organized to serve as a liaison between the residents and the owners of the park.

There has been a growing interest in shuffling and bridge. The park has a bowling team which provides fun and exercise for at least 20 men and women from the manor. Field Day and Bicycle Parade has become an event of early spring. The activities are varied enough to meet the wishes of all park residents.

As the park was developed, names for the streets became necessary. The theme 'light' was carried out in choosing those names. This accounts for the added charm which the street names suggest. Thus, the names Flame, Fireball, Gaslight, Lantern, Torch, etc. were used.



<u>"It's a Funny Lífe"</u> From 1966 to 1975 I worked for the Ohío Department of Líquor Control as a

computer programmer. In the spring of 1969, another programmer and I decided to form a softball team to compete in one of the various leagues run by Columbus Ohio's Division of Parks and Recreation. We solicited sponsor's money from another programmer who ran two part-time busínesses from hís home. He had a small print shop and raised chinchillas. He agreed and we became the "The Valley of the Sun Chinchilla Ranch Softball Team". My job was to design our shirts. I came up with a circle around which our team name appeared with a cartoonish chinchilla standing on its hind legs in the circle's center. Hís ríght arm was extended with a clenched fist and index finger pointing skyward. Unfortunately, the sporting goods store which made our shírts extended a dífferent finger when they translated my design. Our shirts were like a red flag to a bull which brought out the fighting spirit in every team we played. We finished 1-13. Side note: We had the same sponsor for six years. He never gave us anything but \$20 bills for expenses. Several years later he was arrested and convicted for counterfeiting....yes, you guessed it, \$20 bílls.
