Veterans Day Nov. 11, 2015



An Act of Congress approved May 13, 1938, made the 11th of November in each year a legal holiday—a day to be dedicated to the cause of world peace and to be thereafter celebrated and known as "Armistice Day." Armistice Day was primarily a day set aside to honor veterans of World War I, but in 1954, after World War II had required the greatest mobilization of soldiers, sailors, marines, and airmen in the nation's history; after American forces had fought aggression in Korea, the 83rd Congress, at the urging of the veterans' service organizations, amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word "Armistice" and inserting in its place the word "Veterans." With the approval of this legislation on June 1, 1954, November 11th became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.



"It's a Funny Life"

In the late winter/early spring of 1965 I took another of the several

part-time jobs that I had while attending Ohio State. This one was for the State of Ohio Department of Health, Division of Safety and Hygiene. For a little more than 3 months I worked in their mailroom mailing pamphlets on a variety of subjects to requesting parties. My supervisor was a fellow named Tippy Clark. The only other employee whose name I remember was Gene **Fambreau**. In March 1965, the "space race" between the USA and the Soviet Union was a hot issue. Many American experts believed that the Russians were ahead, but that we were rapidly closing the gap. In the US, many people were skeptical of Russia's claims of achievements while others were upset with NASA for being behind. **Gene** was in the first camp, **Tippy** in the second. On March 18, 1965, the Russian Aviation and Space Agency announced that one of their cosmonauts, Alexei Leonov, had "walked" in space. Reportedly, he was outside the spacecraft for over 12 minutes connected to the craft by a 17.5 foot tether. This news sparked a monumental argument between Gene and Tippy. Back and forth they went, making points supporting their respective positions. It ended abruptly with Gene's pronouncement that no one could survive being tied to and stepping out of an airplane flying 200 MPH much less a spacecraft travelling 17,000 MPH.
