A community is a social unit of any size that shares common values. That's not to say that all community members have to agree on everything. This is undeniably true ín Mobíle Manor. Mobíle Manor residents have a long tradition of playing the "I'm not paying the maintenance fees" card. This arises from the fact that the park's founders did not establish an organization which could enforce fee payments. As a result, there has always been a group which just doesn't pay because they feel they don't have to. Then there is a 2<sup>nd</sup>, larger group, which doesn't pay because of greivances. The main example of this happened about 9 years

ago when the Board of Dírectors voted to hire a company to manage the park. This resulted in some board resignations. They stopped paying fees and encouraged others to do the same. This led to a drawn out. expensive lawsuit which virtually bancrupted Mobile Manor. At the lowest point there were only about 130 paying members. Eventually there was a settlement which finally ended the lawsuit. That was over 2 years ago. Since then the paying membership has been as high as 196, we're far removed from bancruptcy, plans are being made to improve the roads, and so on. The results of the recent election indicate that the majority of the paying members endorse the actions of the current Board and its leadership. Nevertheless, the "I'm not paying the maintenance fees" card is being waved around agaín. Frankly, I don't get ít. What is the purpose? Hope that the Board will fail and then next year we'll vote the "rascals" out? Remember, íf you don't pay, you can't vote or run for office, so doesn't it make more sense to keep paying, keep participating, keep holding the Board's feet to the fire, and then, if you're still dissatisfied, put up a slate for the next election? How does not paying \$28 a month help Mobile Manor and, most importantly, help its residents? How does it improve your property values and the quality of life in the park? The motto, "I won't pay, if I don't get my way!!", just doesn't work. So, please, keep paying and if you have grievances, give the new Board an opportunity to address them.
