"The Way We Were" Apr. 1933 - Michigan became the first state to ratify the Twenty-

first Amendment which repealed Prohibition (that figures). Apr. 1938 - Action Comics #1 featuring Superman was published for the 1<sup>st</sup> time. Apr. 1943 - The children's book, A Little Prince was published. Apr. 1948 - President Truman signed the Marshall Plan which authorized \$5 Billion to help 16 countries recover from WW II. Apr. 1953 - Ian Fleming published his 1<sup>st</sup> James Bond novel, Casino Royale. Apr. 1958 -The April 1958 Tornado Outbreak occurred in Florida. It included 4 or 5 tornados which attained F3 intensity or greater. The strongest tornado created F4 damage in Polk County. Apr. 1963 - 88 year old Sir Winston Churchill became the first person to be made an honorary citizen of the U.S. by an act of Congress. Apr. 1968 - Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. was assassinated and President Johnson signed The Civil Rights Bill of 1968.
