So-Quick Seafood Chowder

12 oz. fish fillets 3C frozen hash browns w/ onions and peppers 1 C water 12 oz evaporated mílk of shrimp or potato soup 1/4 C cooked bacon pieces 2t snipped fresh dill 1/4 t pepper 2 oz díced pímentos

Cut fish into 1" pieces; set asíde. In a large saucepan, combine potatoes and water. Boil; reduce heat. Cover and símmer 5 mínutes. Stír ín 10 1/2 oz. condensed cream evaporated milk, condensed soup, bacon, dill and pepper. Cover and simmer for 3 to 5 minutes more or until fish flakes easily. Put in bowls. Garnísh with more fresh díll.
