Korean War The picture to the left is part of the Korean War Veterans Mem-

oríal on the National Mall in Washington. An engraving nearby says, "Our natíon honors her sons and daughters who answered the call to defend a country they never knew and a people they never met." We, in Mobile Manor, want to honor our friends and neighbors who served there. The Battle of the Chosin Reservoir was a decisive event in the war. 30,000 UN troops were encircled by 67,000 Chinese troops. Though surrounded and outnumbered, they "broke out" while inflicting crippling losses on the Chinese. The UN forces suffered major casualties as well. Two Mobile Manor men served in the Marines during the war. Gene Confalone and Bob O'Keefe both proudly embrace the nickname of "The Chosín Few". Thank you for your heroic service. The heavy fighting ended when an armístice was signed on July 27, 1953, but outbreaks of fighting continue to the present day. Others from the park, including Dave Hiatt, Don Manning, Bob Mullins, and August Sims, have served there, too. Thank you all. (If we missed anyone, please let us know.)

WASH AND SEPARATE GRAPE CLUSTERS AND DRAIN. BLEND SOUR CREAM, CREAM CHEESE, VANILLA AND SUGAR TOGETHER. FOLD IN DRY GRAPES AND POUR MIXTURE INTO SERVING DISH (9x13 GLASS PAN). MIX WALNUTS/PECANS AND BROWN SUGAR TOGETHER AND SPRINKLE OVER THE TOP. COVER AND REFRIGERATE OVERNIGHT. SERVE CHILLED.
